THE AIRBORNE & SPECIAL OPERATIONS MUSEUM

The only facility where you can see, hear and experience the comprehensive history of the US Army Airborne and Special Operations units. Includes life-size exhibits, interactive displays, a large screen 250-seat theater and 24-seat simulator where you group can experience airborne training exercises. www.AsomF.org

FORT BRAGG

Among the group favorites on Fort Bragg are: eating at a dining hall with soldiers, touring the parachute packing facility, the 82nd Airborne Division War Memorial Museum and aircraft display, and weapons simulations.

MUSEUM OF THE CAPE FEAR HISTORICAL COMPLEX

A three building complex with a museum building, a restored Victorian house, and Arsenal Park, which houses the remains of the Federal Arsenal, which was destroyed during the Civil War.
